OBJECTIVES OF THE CONFERENCE

The aim of the conference is to present and assess the state-of-the-art in ecological restoration and to bring together scientists, policy makers, practitioners and stakeholders for mutual exchange and synergy. The conference will offer an outstanding opportunity for transboundary contacts and exchanges of knowledge, practices in ecological restoration, an emerging field and profession at the crossroads of applied ecology, ecological, environmental economics and socio-cultural sciences.

THEMES OF THE CONFERENCE

Restoration of ecosystems

- Dry grasslands, heathlands, matorral, steppic and semi-arid vegetation
- Bogs, fens, wet meadows
- Lakes, ponds, wadis (dry river beds), rivers and estuaries
- Marine and coastal ecosystems
- Forests, woodlands and shrublands
- Rocky habitats
- Industrial and polluted areas such as mines

Fragmentation and connectivity in networks of protected sites

- How dense and complete are the networks of protected areas and what connectivity level is needed?
- Restoration actions across national boundaries in the Mediterranean Basin.
- Expected impact of climate change and possible countermeasures
- Expected impact of exotic, invasive species and possible countermeasures

Restoration as the bridge builder between nature conservation and sustainable local economic development

- Socio-economic constraints, benefits, financing opportunities and solutions for promoting and sustaining ecological restoration activities
- Legal constraints and solutions for successful ecological restoration
- Improving collaboration among scientists, policy makers, and practitioners throughout Europe and the Mediterranean Basin.
- Policy measures to cope with loss of traditional management techniques and knowledge

Restoration of habitat quality and improving conditions for reintroduction and reinforcement of populations of endangered species

- Reference values for habitat quality and minimum viable population sizes
- Evaluation of habitat restoration projects
- Evaluation of species reintroduction measures

EXCURSIONS

During excursions to areas near Avignon (*Lubéron, Mont Ventoux, Les Alpilles, the Camargue, Calanques, steppe of La Crau, Berre pond, the Durance and Rhône rivers, Mediterranean islands, coastal dunes, forest and matorral ecosystems, etc.*) lessons learned from various restoration measures will be demonstrated in natural, semi-natural and degraded ecosystems, tackling the typical problems of many millennia of the impacts of human civilizations on Mediterranean ecosystems.
