The SER Mid-Atlantic Chapter is accepting abstracts for oral and poster presentations for the 2015 annual conference program.

Abstracts selected for 15-minute oral presentation will be delivered during concurrent sessions on Friday March 27. Abstracts selected for poster presentation will be displayed all day and presented during the "Poster Pub" late Friday afternoon.

Abstracts should demonstrate clear relevance to the field of ecological restoration and can be submitted into one of the following categories:

- * Scientific
- * Educational
- * Cultural

Authors should also select the most relevant thematic grouping for their submission:

- * Urban
- * Rural
- * Wild

Abstract submission deadline: 31st January 2015

Presentation Formats

Abstracts can be submitted for either an oral or poster presentation. Authors should indicate their preference for an oral or poster presentation during the submission process. However, the Program Committee will make the final allocation of presentation format as it will not be possible for all to give an oral presentation.

Abstract Submission Guidelines - Please submit abstracts to tdoss@biohabitats.com

- Presentations are limited to one oral and one poster presentation per person. You can be listed as a co-author on any number of submissions.
- The presenting author will be notified about the successful submission of their abstract by email once the submission is complete.
- All submitted abstracts will be reviewed by the Program Committee and an acceptance notification will be sent to the presenting author by email no later than 15th February 2015. The email will confirm the mode of presentation (oral or poster).

Abstract Format

Abstracts will be reproduced in the abstract publication exactly in the form they are submitted. Authors are therefore kindly requested to adhere to the following guidelines. Failure to do so may result in the abstract not being accepted.

- Title: This should be a maximum of 20 words and typed in sentence case.
- Authors: The presenting author should be listed first and up to five co-authors can also be included.
- Author Affiliations: The affiliation details of all authors (institution, department, city/town, state [if relevant] and country) must be included.
- Word Limit: The main body of the abstract text cannot exceed 300 words and should be text only.

Best Student Paper/Poster

If you are a student presenter and would like your presentation to be judged for the Best Student Paper or Best Student Poster award, please tick the box on the submission form. There is no monetary value assigned to these awards but you will receive a certificate and formal recognition during the closing plenary session.
