July 2, 3 & 4, 2015 Shoe Lake, Nopiming Provincial Park

Are you interested in learning about and exploring the Boreal Forest on the East Side of Lake Winnipeg? Would you like to learn the low-down on boreal forest ecology and forest management, wildlife management (including deer, moose and the threatened woodland caribou), water quality, climate change and more? Want to know how to take this information and plug it into your lesson plans? What you learn can be easily integrated into lesson plans for all grade levels.



Join the Manitoba Model Forest (MBMF), a non-profit organization dedicated to boreal forest research and to bringing all stakeholders together for the better management of our forest resources, for 3 days of learning and exploring in Nopiming Provincial Park.

Cost:

\$150. This includes all food and accommodations, and transportation from Lac du Bonnet to Shoe Lake. Just meet us at the Manitoba Conservation office in Lac du Bonnet on July 2, and we will provide the vehicles to take you to Shoe Lake and back (you can park your vehicle at MB Conservation during the workshop).

You Bring:

Sleeping bag and foam mattress, pillow, personal items (camera, toiletries, beach towel - for swimming or for taking a bath in the lake), rain jacket, bug repellent, sunscreen, writing pad, beverages of choice, hiking boots (or sturdy shoes), flashlight, fishing gear. Bring a tent if you want to camp out, or stay in the cabins if you wish.

We Supply:

All food, transportation to Shoe Lake, accommodations at the Shoe Lake Fire Fighting Training Facility, provincially-accredited curriculum supplements, canoes and life jackets (yes, plenty of time for canoeing)



#### Activities

- Presentations on forest management, wildlife management (including caribou), water quality, climate change
- Walk and talk to identify boreal forest plants and trees. Fun facts about the boreal.
- Visit to Black Lake to see the MBMF caribou information kiosk
- Hiking
- Hands-on training on forest monitoring
- Visit to forest harvest (clear cut) areas
- We will walk you through our curriculum supplement materials
- Canoeing and fishing, evening fireside chats
