

Natural re-establishment of sagebrush within wildfireimpacted areas is a slow process that can take decades or even centuries. Since 2014, the Douglas Core Area Restoration Team has planted 100,000⁺ sagebrush seedlings within 5000⁺ acres of a Sage-grouse Core Population Area of eastern Wyoming. This presentation will highlight the role of collaborative conservation in enhancing habitat for Greater Sage-grouse, along with data-supported lessons the Team has learned through their research investigating environmental constraints to sagebrush growth, survival, and recruitment.
