The newly formed Northern Arizona University Society for Ecological Restoration Student Association (SER NAU) hasn't wasted any time getting to work on exciting restoration projects in our community. We have been busy preparing a site for a native plant garden at the student run SNAIL garden on the NAU campus, as well as working with local group TERRA Birds to install native plants at the Museum of Northern Arizona. With early snows blanketing the Flagstaff area, ten of us headed south for warmer weather to help Friends of the Verde River remove invasive Tree of Heaven (Ailanthus altissima) near Cottonwood, AZ. We plan to take advantage of the quiet winter months to coordinate a monkey flower fundraiser, prepare a proposal for the NAU Green Fund to support the SNAIL garden, and continue to make connections to increase our involvement in the Northern Arizona restoration community. Overall, the first semester of SER NAU has been marked by an inspiring enthusiasm from both undergraduate and graduate students to get involved, share ideas, and bring those ideas to life.




