Organization of virtual meeting/workshop

- Single webinar or workshop OR
 - Full meeting
- a) Steve has been participating in Desert Horticulture meeting; have 5 days to view as many programs as you want
 - Doesn't have interaction but
 - Don't have to be at a specific place at a specific time
 - Speakers recording their PPT
 - *Series of pre-recorded talks that will be online*
 - *Could couple with discussion sessions*
 - b) Could still also have some live workshops; some pre-recorded
 - c) Or have speaker speak live; still record for others to view later
 - d) Both ESA and ConBio are doing this hybrid model
 - e) Concurrent sessions are due to constraints of space and time which we wouldn't have for this; might have fewer sessions but could spread it out (rather than doing concurrent)
 - f) Have all sessions recorded so could go to live or view later depending on schedule constraints
 - g) Logistics of recording presentations?
 - a. Upload PPT prior to presenting
 - b. Who is recording? Speaker or us?
 - h) Does SER have a license to accommodate ~100 people on a webinar
 - i) Loralee – GoReact platform used to upload PPT presentations, there is a comment box to add Q&A; have been using Zoom to record (go into Zoom by yourself and record)

- a. Can also narrate slides in PPT
- j) Molly attended Climate Resilience workshop – having a large group with live Q&A is engaging
 - a. Live, recorded and/or live engagement options
- k) Shawn – blended conference option?
 - a. Plenary – live
 - b. Students – recorded talks
 - c. Etc
- l) Elise – virtual poster presentation; uploaded and can view at leisure; can post comments or questions
- m) U of A – can get ~150 people through Zoom license
- n) Opportunity to reach a wider audience
- o) Cost? \$35 each with 100% going to grants?
- p) Elise will send out list of possibilities; pros and cons; zoom restrictions if any
- q) Others will check with other groups doing virtual meetings
- r) Timeline for when we want to send out RFP for proposals
