Professor Gentry addressed the topic "Microbial Remediation of Uranium-Contaminated Groundwater" in which he described his work on the microbial remediation of uranium-contaminated groundwater.

Dr. William E. Rogers will be our guest speaker on October 28 at 5:30 pm in HFSB 105. The title of his presentation will be "Hercules and the Hydra: Are mechanical, chemical, and/or grazing treatments of resprouting woody plants more effective when combined with fire?" The public is welcome to attend.

The Bastrop fire relief project that we have worked on for the past few years is coming to an end, and we will be replanting our last few loblolly pines in late October.

We also have a scheduled visit to the Armand Bayou Nature Center in Houston in November, where we will volunteer with planting native forbs and grasses in a wetland setting. The Armand Bayou Nature Center will provide us with seeds of native Texas grasses, which we will grow in our campus greenhouses until they are ready to be transplanted into restoration areas in the spring semester.
