Briefly describe your ongoing efforts/interest in ecological **restoration.** I have worked at South Texas Natives for the past 10 years and have worked in almost every position within the project. South Texas Natives (STN) mission is to develop and promote native plants for the restoration and reclamation of habitat on private and public lands. Our primary focus is to collect, evaluate, and release seed of important south Texas plants to commercial seed producers, By 2016, STN will have released over 30 South Texasorigin native seed products. Commercial seed production has resulted in enough seed to plant over 30,000 acres annually with STN releases. A large part of my job is to work with commercial seed producers to ensure that our releases are being grown by commercial growers at a large enough scale to meet the demand. Another aspect of our project is to develop and implement strategies to reestablish native plants and minimize the influence of introduced species on native habitats. To do this we conduct numerous research and demonstration projects throughout South Texas to test not only the seed sources, but also their potential use in highway right-of-way plantings, oil and gas exploration reclamation, and native range and wildlife plantings. Once research is completed we disseminate the results via scientific article publications, newsletters, meetings, and numerous field days for on the ground learning opportunities.
