












Eradication Overview

- Removal of every single animal
- Maintaining all invasive alien species off the islands for 2 years minimum
- Retaining invasive free status in perpetuity as aspirational goal.
- Starts with knockdown method needs to remove 70-90% of animals
- Mop up method removes wary and sparse remainder
- Grid searches confirms zero Canada

Three phase operation

- 1. Bait station hunting
- 2. Aerial Hunting
- 3. Dog and Ground hunting





Learning and Preparing

Since the summer of 2015, Collinson has worked on Llgaay gwii sdiihlda recording plant growth, monitoring tree and shrub vegetation plots, collaring deer, and learning to shoot under stress (hitting targets at various distances in in 20-30 second intervals)
